Dear friends,

As I sit and write this, Advent Sunday is not far away, a time of year I really love. Just before Advent starts, on Sunday 26th November, Christ the King Sunday, we are gathering at 11.30am for our Every Decade service, with lunch in the parish centre afterwards. Advent Sunday is the first Sunday in December and this Advent we are holding three Advent reflections, at 8pm in the parish centre, on Wednesday 29th November, Wednesday 6th December and Wednesday 13th December, where we will explore scripture through the light of Advent, with accompanying refreshments!

Advent is a season when we concentrate on the coming light of our world. As the days draw closer and the evenings get darker, the brighter a light shines. That light is the coming of our Lord.

We are having a Christmas Communion Service in Calary, followed by lunch in the church room, on Wednesday 6th December at 11am. This is an opportunity to attend a Communion Service before Christmas and to bring along anyone who may not always be able to come to church on Sunday mornings with a social element of a festive lunch afterwards.

Christmas will be firmly on our minds as we gather in St. Matthew's church on December 9th, to enjoy some early festive fun with crafts, food, music and carols, the Wicklow Parkinsons Choir, plus a visit from Santa! We hope to raise funds for the Al Ahli hospital, an Anglican run hospital in Gaza that has been badly damaged.

It is always wonderful to gather as a community to celebrate this special time of the year. On December 10th, the Sunday Club will perform their nativity play in Newcastle church and the Junior choir will sing! At 5pm on Sunday 10th, our Community Crib is returning to Newcastle village, with community carol singing and hot chocolate! We will have our carol services on December 17th in Newcastle and December 20th in Calary.







Wildlife in December

As temperatures drop, **red foxes** grow extra fur over the winter months to protect them from the cold, while **the stoat** changes the colour of its coat to fit in with a wintery landscape.

The scarcity of food resources bring more birds to garden feeders. On a cold night a bird can use up to 10% of its body weight, so high-fat foods are essential for survival. A good variety of food can attract a whole range of species. Try suet fat, fruit, seeds, kitchen scraps, crumbs, mealworms, sunflower hearts and peanuts alongside bird seed. Fresh drinking water will help on frozen days. It's important to be consistent with the food you provide as the birds will add you to their daily food-route, using vital energy to visit your feeder. Little songbirds like **blue tits** and **wrens** might use bird boxes to shelter in overnight.

Red squirrels are now at their most photogenic. Though they have adorable ear tufts all year, these become longer and even more extravagantly fluffy in winter, after the autumn moult. Despite their name, the squirrels' coat colour may vary a great deal, from brick-red to dark brown, often with blonde highlights in the ears or tail.



Ladybirds overwinter in huddles, occasionally dozens strong, and these may be seen in cracks in bark and walls, around window frames or under piles of leaves. You're most likely to meet seven-spot ladybirds and non-native harlequins, but others to look for include the black-on-yellow 16-spot ladybird. Some clusters seem very exposed, yet these beetles are toxic. The brighter the colours, the more toxic the species.



For some birds, freezing spells lasting any longer than a couple of days can be a major cause of mortality.

Kingfishers are particularly susceptible, as are grey herons, barn owls (because their rodent prey stays underground), and insectivorous species such as goldcrests. A big freeze sends their populations tumbling, though numbers recover after a run of mild winters.

Hazel trees already have male catkins – small and green at first, then swelling and opening in a blaze of yellow.

In Britain, the royal family – especially Queen Charlotte, wife of George III – helped to popularise the Germanic tradition of bringing an evergreen tree indoors to decorate at Christmas. It's less well known that the custom originally involved a **yew tree**, or just a solitary branch. Yew was used both in the British Isles, where it is one of only three native conifers, and in Germany, home to a wider range of species.



Non-alcoholic Mulled Wine

Ingredients

- 500ml pomegranate juice
 25g golden caster sugar
 handful of frozen blackberries
 250ml apple juice
 1 cinnamon stick
 1 star anise
 4 cloves
 - 3 black peppercorns
 1 orange, quartered

Method

Put the pomegranate juice, sugar, blackberries and apple juice in a saucepan.

Add the cinnamon, star anise, cloves, peppercorns and orange.

Heat gently until simmering.

Taste for sweetness, then strain into heatproof glasses.




