From the Rector's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

As I sit and write these few thoughts, the feelings I have are of being overwhelmed. Life can change very quickly for any of us and those changes often help us to have a more realistic view about lots of things. The most striking reality for me has been the love and support received from my family, hundreds of parishioners, the local community and numerous people from far and near. I really do appreciate that great body of genuine support, care and love. I must mention the paramedics in the ambulance service, the nurses and all in the cardiac care unit at St. Vincent's Hospital; they were outstanding in their professionalism and care.

I literally have received hundreds of cards and messages of good-will which all meant a lot, but one card brought great assurance and reaffirmed one of the great truths for us in trusting God. Two hand painted shoes are on the front of the card and on it is written these, very true, words - 'If God sends us on stony places he provides strong shoes'. The most important reality for me during some of those very uncertain days was a great sense of peace, whatever the outcome might be.. God really did provide the shoes, and His peace and assurance is something hard to describe.

I want to say a heartfelt thank you to all those who immediately stepped in to ensure that everything continued, as far as possible, in the three churches and parishes. Canon Fred Appelbe has not only assumed responsibility for the business of the parish as rural Dean, but has been a real pastor, source of strength and friend to me. He has been helped by the lay readers Caroline and Michael, by Rev John Marchant and by Canon John Clarke who is available to respond to emergencies or sick calls. Many other people have stepped up to the mark and deserve mention but in particular I pay tribute to Karen who is firmly in the driving seat of most of what happens in the Parish. I am not sure yet how long it might be until I can resume normal duties but I can relax knowing that God makes no mistakes and you are all doing your best to ensure His work continues. I know that many of you have gifts and talents which I don't have and my hope and prayer is that this will be a time of real growth for many of us when we see those gifts used to God's Glory. If this happens we will all have learned and grown in ways we never expected.


Mobile Phone Lessons for Adults
